Pullorum-Typhoid Testing Change

Regulations have changed for exhibition at the County Fairs throughout the state. Kansas is currently a P-T free state, so the surveillance level has decreased. Different counties have been assigned a rotation of every five years for testing. Our year for testing will be 2025. If you are bringing birds that originated in Kansas to the Fair, you will not have to have them tested until then. Any birds purchased from out-of-state, will need to come from a NPIP flock or have a negative test 90 days prior to the county fair. If importing birds, you must also follow the state import requirements. The statement of origin is attached.

Any birds that are going to State Fair, will be tested at the State Fairgrounds. Details are still being worked out about that. NPIP facilities are required to test every year, so that is why if the birds come from one of those facilities, you don't have to test. If you are purchasing birds at swap meets, ask where they have originated to know if they are from Kansas or not. If you purchase birds from out-of-state after April 21 and they are not from an NPIP facility, ask if they have been tested for P-T. If they have been tested or originated from an NPIP facility, you do not need to do anything else. If they have not been tested, you will need to have them tested.

Ultimately, in-state birds, no action until 2025. Out-of-state birds need to originate from NPIP facility or be tested within 90 days of the Fair.

Don't wait to get your envelopes ordered or animals tagged. Please contact the office early to schedule the EID tagging of your **STATE ONLY** animals. Nominations must be postmarked by their deadline.

Important Heartbeat:

- Terminal **Locker Destinations** are final and may not be changed after the first Friday in July (an email has been sent to all livestock members with the link to select destinations and will be due **July 7, 2023**. Locker spots will be on a first come, first serve basis and may have limited availability.)
- Terminal **Floor Destinations** are final and must be selected at fair weigh-in
- The minimum weight for Swine has been lowered to **210 pounds** to sell through the Premium Auction.
 - **TIP:** The scale will be open all-day Friday of the Fair if you are concerned your animal(s) may be a little light. Ask your species superintendents for safe ways to help gain before Saturday's official weigh-in!

Important Static:

- For food safety purposes, any entries with frostings and fillings must calculate the amount of sugar in the frosting/filling recipe only. Calculation must be attached to entry, or the placing will be lowered one ribbon when judged. Frosting and fillings need to contain more than 65% sugar for safety. - STEM: ABC – please check the 2023 State Fair fairbook for updated rules and regulations. Building Creations will be offered at the local level and no packet will be required.

Breeding Registration Papers Required

As a reminder, registration papers must be submitted with your FairEntry submission for all purebred breeding animals. Any breeding animals without papers will be shown in the Commercial Breeding class. County Fair Registration

We will be using [FairEntry](#) again this year to obtain all fair entries. 4-H division entries must be submitted during open enrollment: **Friday, June 2 through Friday, July 7. Entries that will be judged prior to July 21 MUST be entered by Friday, June 30.** Additional family resources are attached with the June Newsletter.

FairEntry is integrated with 4HOnline project enrollment per youth. If your youth was not enrolled by Monday, May 1 in a specific project, they must showcase in the Open Class Division.

Youth enrolled in the Dog Care & Training project do not have to upload vaccines into FairEntry. Please give to Jenny at practice or before the dog show at the County Fair.

Open Class pre-entries for animals are required. All other projects are strongly encouraged but will still be accepted at check-in. For questions, please contact the office.

2023 Livestock Destinations

Locker spots have been secured again this year at Alta Vista Meat Co (Alta Vista), Diamond A Processing (Junction City), and Farview Farms Meat Co (Topeka). Locker spots are limited and on a first come, first serve basis. **DO NOT CALL THE LOCKER TO ARRANGE YOUR PREFERENCE.**

Now is the time to begin seeking both carcass and premium buyers for your animals! The livestock sale is a premium only (ribbon) auction. Carcasses will not be sold through the auction, exhibitors are responsible for finding their own carcass buyers. Floor buyer will be available for Goats, Sheep, Poultry & Rabbits ONLY. Youth must designate 'Floor Buyer' at fair check in.

Carcass buyer information will also be collected with the [2023 Livestock Destinations Qualtrics Survey](#). It is imperative to provide complete information as it will be given to the lockers for billing and direct contact concerning their meat processing.

Static Check-In

All 4-H and Open Class static check-in, with the exception of plant science, will take place on **Friday (07/21) 4:00 – 8:00 p.m.** under the awning of the South Fair Barn.

To streamline any possible class changes, please include an identifying description on all static entries through FairEntry. Classes and descriptions can be changed at static check-in.

Banners, Booths & Hay Bales

A few schedule changes, please pay close attention to updated check-in time for Club Banners and Hay Bale location! Hay Bales will be judged first followed by booth then banner. Hay Bales will be placed on the South side of KanEquip Arena.

King & Queen Scholarship Program

Interviews will be Wednesday, July 12, 5:00 p.m.
Location: Marlow-Lietz Building

Selection of the King and Queen for the Wabaunsee County Fair will be based on a combination of application, 4-H records and an interview with a panel of judges. The King and Queen will receive a \$500 leadership and education scholarship to be used for a state or national 4-H event or for higher education. A score of 130 will be required to receive the honor.

Major points to be considered include:

- Leadership
- Contribution to club and community
- Project involvement and accomplishment
- Impact of candidate's 4-H career
- Poise & Character
- Ability to communicate effectively

All 4-H members who are 14 by January 1 are eligible for this award. 4-H clubs are encouraged to nominate at least one individual for King and one for Queen. Candidates will then be required to turn in the King & Queen Application Checklist, Questionnaire and Record Book by the first Friday in July. The record book must include:

- Current Personal Page
- Current Story
- Updated Permanent Record
- Copy of 2020-2021, 2021-2022 Completed Record Books (Personal Page, 4-H Story, KAP or Project Page, Permanent Record)

If any of the application materials listed above are not turned in or complete, the candidate will be disqualified.

All application materials are due to the Extension Office by 5:00 p.m. on July 7!

Fairground Clean-Up

Report any damage to facilities or exhibits to Extension Staff or a Fair Board Member.

Friendly Farmers

- **North Exhibit Building** – Pick up all trash and sweep floors each morning.
- **South Exhibit Building** – Pick up all trash and sweep floors each morning.

Happy Valley

- **All Restrooms** – ONLY: Check the paper towel and toilet paper dispensers throughout the day.
- **Exhibit Buildings (Outside)** – Pick up trash around each exhibit building and the concession stand, and deposit it in trash barrels. Empty trash barrels into dumpster when full.
- **Outside of Livestock Barns** – Pick up all trash & put in trash barrels. Empty trash barrels into dumpster when full. Be sure that all water hydrants are turned off at end of evening.

Maple Hill Hustlers

- **Arenas** – Pick up paper trash in & around Show Arena and Cowboys' Arena each morning before shows begin. Empty trash barrels into dumpster when full. Notify Fair Board of burned out lights.

Newbury

- **Picnic Tables** – Pick up all trash on and around picnic tables and booths.
- **Rolling Trash Cans** – Daily, by 8:00 a.m. spread out trash cans across the fairgrounds. By 8:00 p.m. gather all full trash cans and place in designated location for emptying each morning. Please see Mary Reed for location placement.

The bathrooms will be cleaned every morning, please thank the Fair Board for the service!

Record Books

The Project Report Forms are age specific. All static will use the **General Project Report Form** and all heartbeat projects will use the **Animal Project Report Form**. These new forms have made record keeping for your 4-H projects more concise. ZBooks is available for all youth interested in using the ZBooks software! The Permanent Record is included in ZBooks. **If you choose to keep records with ZBooks, do not feel like you have to transfer over all of your previous years' activities in to the online Permanent Record.** Start with this year and attach it to your previous document.
